The team's work:

ECCF Social Services staff work as advocates for all and assists the entire population with various barriers they may face during their incarceration. Below are some examples of the services we provide:

Social Services Responsibilities:

- Notarize documents, property releases, power of attorney form, 5-A forms, and authorization forms.
- Provide envelopes, writing supplies, and certified mail slips for indigent inmates.
- Look up charges, bails, assigned public defenders and private counsel.
- Discharge Planning (upon request): linking and referring inmates with resources and services prior to release if needed (i.e. shelters, drug treatment programs, food pantry, vocational services, financial services).
- Assist inmates with obtaining their birth certificate,
 Social Security card and Essex County identification
 card.
- Facilitate psychosocial groups/classes.
- · Provide reading materials to inmates.




Celebrating Black History Month

Did you know? Black History Facts

- 2/01/1865 The 13th Amendment to the U.S.
 Constitution, which abolished slavery, was adopted by the 38th Congress.
- 2/03/1920 The Negro Baseball League was founded.
- 2/04/1913 Rosa Parks was born.
- 2/06/1867 Robert Tanner Jackson becomes the 1st African American to receive a degree in dentistry.
- 2/08/1986 Oprah Winfrey becomes the 1st African American woman to host a nationally syndicated talk show
- 2/10/1964 The U.S. House of Representatives vote to pass the Civil Rights of 1964 by a vote of 290-130.
- 2/11/1990 Nelson Mandela is released from a South African prison after being detained for 27 years as a political prisoner.
- 2/12/1909 The National Association for the Advancement of Color People (NAACP) was founded.

- 2/16/1926 Carter G. Woodson started the Negro History Week which later became known as Black History Month.
- 2/22/1979 Frank E. Peterson Jr. was named the 1st black general in the Marine Corps.
- 2/24/1864 Rebecca Lee became the 1st black woman to receive an M.D. Degree.
- 2/26/1869 The 15th Amendment guaranteeing the right to vote was sent to the states for ratification.
- 2/28/1859 Arkanansas' legislature required free blacks to choose between exile and enslavement.
- 2/28/1870 Hirman R. Revels of Mississippi was sworn in as the first black U.S. Senator and first black representative.
- 2/28/1932 Richard Spikes invented/patented the automatic gear shift.



Every Women's History Month has a theme. The theme for March 2023 is "Celebrating Women Who Tell Our Stories."

- In 1756, Lydia Taft became the first legal woman voter in colonial America.
- In July 1848, Elizabeth Cady Stanton and Lucretia Mott organized the first women's rights convention in Seneca Falls, NY.
- Susan B. Anthony and Elizabeth Cady Stanton founded the National Woman Suffrage Association in 1869.
- The first Women's History Day took place in 1909.
- International Women's Day became a holiday in 1911.
- The first major march on Washington by suffragists happened on March 3, 1913.
- Colorado became the last state to allow women to vote in 1919.
- Women's History Day became Women's History Week in 1978.
- Women's History Month began in 1987.
